Job Description for: Children and Families/Next Generation Leader

Main Duties:

- Manage and grow the Children's Ministry Team of volunteers; arranging and leading regular team meetings and exploring training opportunities.
- Organise the children's and youth curriculum for Sunday mornings using our Curriculum provider **Orange**, meeting with volunteer leaders to plan sessions.
- Co-ordinate the children's and youth rota for Sunday mornings.
- Serve with high frequency on Sunday mornings.
- Organise and lead our midweek youth groups on a Tuesday and Friday.
- Organise and lead our Messy Church ministry and it's team of volunteers.
- Attend regular staff meetings.
- Work closely with Designated Safeguarding Leads in maintaining high standards of safeguarding practice.
- Participate when appropriate in deliver assemblies/classroom projects to local schools and help to develop themes for them.
- To ensure that all children and young people within the life of the church are discipled, growing in their personal faith with Jesus and have opportunity to explore and use their God-given gifts.
- To widen the reach of the church toward children and young people in the community, ensuring those whom we come into contact with have an opportunity to hear and make an informed decision to respond to the Gospel of Jesus Christ.
- Develop and pioneer new evangelistic ways to reach or disciple children and young people in North End, Portsmouth, in line with your own gifting and passions (e.g., music, drama, sports, dance etc.).

- Ability to work effectively with other adults in the church.
- Ability to work on own and be self-motivated.
- Ability to work well with other churches and organisations in the local community.
- Rich in the fruit of the Spirit love, joy, peace, patience, goodness, kindness, gentleness and self-control.
